

"The County" -

Rooted in the Loyalist Era Day Bus Tour to

PEC, Picton and the Rose House

Saturday 23 August 2014 Gov. Simcoe Branch

Join historian Peter Brotherhood as we visit "The County". Some 500 Loyalists (plus disbanded British and German allied troops) settled here subsequent to the American Revolution. Captain Justus Sherwood carried out a reconnaissance survey of Prince Edward in 1783, and the following year, surveyor Collins came ashore at Prinyer's Cove, erected a log cabin and began to survey the "5th township", now Marysburg, the first to be done in the County. The first Loyalist settlers, led by Lieutenant Archibald MacDonnell, arrived in the fall of 1784.

Rose House Museum

Rose House has survived since the early 1800s with few alterations, inhabited by 5 generations of the Rose family. Peter Rose arrived in Prince Edward County among first Marysburgh settlers. According to tradition, Rose House is constructed from salvaged timber from the community's original Lutheran Church. Peter and his wife, Christina Bongard, raised 11 children in this modest farmhouse.

Macaulay Heritage Park



Macaulay Heritage Park is an attractive historic site featuring many points of interest: Macaulay House, built in 1830 and restored to the mid 1850s; the historic former Church of St. Mary Magdalene, now the Prince Edward County Museum; the old St. Mary Magdalene Parish Cemetery; the Heritage Gardens and the Carriage House. Reverend William Macaulay was originally sent to this area as a missionary.
