May 18, 1776	 Flight of Sir John Johnson and 170 followers to Canada from Johnstown, through the Adirondacks for 19 days
June 19, 1776	- Formation of Johnson's King's Royal Regiment of New York
May 4, 1783	- Landing of the Loyalists at Shelburne, Nova Scotia
May 18, 1783	- Landing of the Loyalists at Saint John, N.B.
July 30, 1783	 Major Ross and 25 officers and 422 other ranks arrived at Cataraqui to rebuild Fort Frontenac and prepare for settlement of Loyalists
October 8, 1783	- Landing of Loyalists at Fredericton, N.B.
Dec. 24, 1783	- All Loyalist Regiments and Companies in Lower Canada were disbanded
May 22, 1784	- Landing of the Mohawks at Tyendinaga (Deseronto, Ontario) the first Loyalist allies to settle in Upper Canada
May 25, 1784	- Capt. Michael Grass and party left Sorel for Fort Frontenac (Kingston, Ont.)
June 12, 1784	- First Loyalists settlement by Michael Grass at Kingston, Ontario
June 16, 1784	- Landing of Peter Van Alstine's band of Loyalists at Adolphustown on the Bay of Quinte, Ontario
June 24, 1784	- All Loyalist Regiments in Upper Canada disbanded
May 27, 1914	- The incorporation of the United Empire Loyalists' Association of Canada on May 27 1914 by an Act of Dominion Parliament
