

Descendants of Valentine Cryderman

Generation No. 1

1. VALENTINE¹ CRYDERMAN died 1780 in Johnstown, Tyrone County, New York. He married CATHERINE BENNETT.

Notes for VALENTINE CRYDERMAN:

When the war broke out in 1775, Valentine Cryderman was living in Johnstown, Tyrone County, New York with his wife, Catherine, and their sons and daughters. They were of Dutch descent, their parents having come from Holland many years prior. He had one hundred and twenty-five acres of land, farm stock and considerable other property all of which was confiscated by the new government at the close of the war. The family early identified with the Loyalists and four sons united with the British in active service until the close of the war.

Valentine was imprisoned many months for refusing to renounce his oath of allegiance to the British Crown. The abuse and deprivation brought on severe illness from which he never recovered and which resulted in his death in the year 1780. At the close of the war, his wife, sons and daughters set out for Canada bringing only what they could carry.

They came through forest until they reached what is now Oswego and finally what is now Cornwall in June, 1784. The first house in which they lived was built on Lot 12, Concession 3 near Cornwall and was built of logs filled with pieces of wood and plastered with clay. It was 20 ft. by 15 ft. with blankets for the door. (This information was given to me by the family of Florence Hardy, a descendent of John Cryderman who was the youngest son of Michael Cryderman Sr. and Mary Hicks.

2. MICHAEL² CRYDERMAN (*VALENTINE*¹) was born in Johnstown, Tyrone County, New York. He married MARY HICKS, daughter of EDWARD HICKS and ELVINA (*LEVINA*). She was born Abt. 1763 in Dutchess County N.Y..

Notes for MICHAEL CRYDERMAN:

Michael was a soldier in the Royal Regiment of New York on the Soldier Muster Roll (Provision List 1786 British Regiment). His wife, Mary Hicks, was also of Loyalist stock. Her father was Edward Hicks Sr. a

soldier with Butler's Rangers who died in New York in 1779. Her siblings consisted of Daniel, David, Joseph, Edward, Elizabeth, Benjamin and Mary herself. Michael and Mary's family is listed on page 356 of the addenda in William D. Reid's book, *Loyalists in Ontario* (1973 Hunterdon House). It also states there that Michael was of Marysburgh, Hollowell and Cramahe Township. (See Ontario Archives Report 1904).

Levina's Order-in-Council was dated Jan. 14, 1812. It was located at Lot 33, Concession 5 of Hamilton Township and is still in the Goheen family in 2005.
