The branch has maintained the Loyalist cemetery on the

site and Brian has been instrumental in the renovation of the Loyalist monument there.

UELAC Annual Conference Toronto, June 5-8, 2014 By Sylvia Powers

We met at the Eaton Chelsea Hotel in downtown Toronto with sunny weather. The subway running from Bloor to Union was closed for repairs so I got to line up for buses coming and going from my room north of Bloor. From our branch came Marg Hall, Lynne Webb, Gary Bagley, and myself. Little did we know that this would be Lynne's last conference.

On Thursday at the welcome reception we heard Peter C. Newman give a witty preview of his book "Hostages to fortune: the vanguard of a great nation" due to be published next year. Fred Hayward presented the book he had edited "Loyally Yours: 100 Years of the UELAC" in which a history is given of the events leading up to the formation of the association and includes histories from the various branches across Canada.

On Friday we had a choice of taking a bus tour to explore Mississauga's Loyalist past or attending the seminars. I attended the latter. We were told how to preserve our documents (Do not use paper clips). Todd Braistead spoke of the military records of The New Jersey Volunteers, 1776-1783. Marian Press showed us how to add social context to our family history by using online sources. Jane MacNamara told us what was available in Prerogative, Probate, and Surrogate courts, as well as wills in land records. Lesley Anderson demonstrated how to find pre-confederation records through Ancestry.ca. Buses came to shuttle us to Burwash Hall, Victoria College, at the University of Toronto. This brought back fond memories to Marg Hall of her time there in the Gothic building. After a delayed dinner (due to waiting for a bus which seemed to have become lost for a while), we listened to a group called "Muddy York" sing traditional songs of the past.

After the AGM on Saturday, we could chose a walking tour or a rest. I chose to check out the Toronto Branch library and then have a short rest. Dressing in period dress, I took the subway to catch a bus part way to the hotel in time for the gala reception and dinner. A few past presidents including Okill Stuart, Bernice Flett, Bill Terry, Myrna Fox, and the four in the last decade were honoured. Dinner was really good and my need for glutten-free and vegetarian food was well met. The Dorchester Award was presented to Fred Hayward for his efforts on the Association's behalf. The Opera "Molly of the Mohawks" was presented. It was wonderful.

It was a very enjoyable conference. Next year the conference will be in Victoria, May 28-31, 2015. I plan to be there. How about you?
