A Visit to the Lost Villages Museum – by Penny Minter

On a beautiful July day, I made the short 1 hour drive from Ottawa to the Lost Villages Museum located in Ault Park just east of Long Sault, Ontario. The purpose of my trip was a visit to the Fran Laflamme Memorial Resource Centre which is located in the Forbes Memorial Reading Room. The Forbes Memorial Reading Room was originally the Newington Library built in 1901 and was moved to the Lost Villages site in 2001. It now houses the archives of the six lost villages of Moulinette, Farran’s Point, Aultsville, Dickinson’s Landing, Mille Roches, Wales and the three lost hamlets of Maple Grove, Santa Cruz and Woodlands. There is also an extensive collection on the St. Lawrence Seaway and shipping. Genealogical material including birth, marriage and death records, baptism records, census records, cemetery transcriptions, newspaper clippings, journals and newsletters is available for public research.



The resource centre is chock full of artifacts from the Lost Villages and the original UE settlers. Too many to go through in just 1 day. Of particular interest to Loyalist researchers is the 1862 Walling map of Stormont, Dundas, Glengarry, Prescott & Russell. This map shows the names of many of the descendants of the original UE settlers.



The museum is open to the public during the summer months and the reading room is open year round by appointment. There is no charge for admission, but, donations are gratefully accepted.
