Report on the 2019 Spring Social/Annual General Meeting

The 2019 Spring Social/AGM was held at the Carlingwood Branch, Ottawa Public Library. Approximately 22 Branch members and guests attended.

After a brief social time, the AGM was called to order by Branch President Rosemarie Pleasant at 1:30 pm. Rosemarie gave a brief welcome and new Branch members Laura Griffin, Warren Peters & Wally Vrooman were introduced. The Minutes of the 2018 AGM were reviewed and it was moved by Marg Hall & seconded by Sue Moss that they be accepted as written. All in favour.

Bob Adair handed out the Treasurer report for January-December 2018. The Branch is in good position financially and it was moved by Dorothy Meyerhof & seconded by Shirley Charbonneau that the report be accepted. All in favour. As Bob is stepping down as Treasurer, Rosemarie thanked him for his many years of service to the Branch and wished him well.

Gary Bagley reported that the Branch is ahead of last year's membership with 76 members. Three certificates were awarded last year, Penny Minter for her ancestor Martin Alguire, Catherine Bastedo-Boileau for her ancestor Jacob Bastedo and William Leach for his ancestor Benjamin Eastman. Gary also reported that there are several certificate applications currently in process.

Dorothy Meyerhof reported that the Branch library now has over 1000 books and 19 periodicals. There have been over 3400 hits on the Branch website.

The speaker at the Spring AGM/Social, Mags Gaulden gave us a view of the future of family research, using online genealogy. Mags specialises in the use of DNA testing for family research. Grandma's genes www.grandmasgenes.com <<http://www.grandmasgenes.com>> use both traditional and genetic tools. She described how genealogy websites used different sources and tools, and have varying results depending on the gene pool. She outlined current problems with online tools and the efforts of various boards and organizations work together to resolve them (i.e. use by law information and insurance companies). One project of particular interest is the WikiTree project. WikiTree is a free online tool that is trying to be an accurate, sourced resource for genealogists and family historians. The 2019 Dominion Conference and AGM was held at the Hilton Double Tree hotel in Gatineau, QC from May 30 – June 2. There were 150 attendees registered for the conference, but, unfortunately, due to unforeseen circumstances several individuals were unable to attend. The attendees represented 9 provinces and 4 US states. The conference by the numbers : 150 attendees, number of speakers 12 plus 2 performers at the banquet, number of donors to the silent auction 32 which generated \$1,176.00 and finally 12 volunteers.

Those who were present enjoyed a weekend full of entertainment, tours and exciting presentations. The opening reception Thursday evening began with remarks from the conference chair, Sylvia Powers, SGC Branch President Rosemarie Pleasant and welcoming messages from the Governor General Julie Payette, the MP for Hull-Aylmer, Greg Fergus and the Mayor of Gatineau Maxime Pedneaud Jobin. Brian is an excellent tour guide and very knowledgeable about the area. Those remaining at the hotel had a choice of presentations to attend in the afternoon.
