Step 2 should have helped you figure out where in the microfilm your document is. Is it in the first section of C-2027 or towards the end? There are approximately 1100 pages in each of this microfilm. I type in a page number where I think my document might be. Then it is sort of trial and error but I can usually find what I am looking for in a couple minutes as each of the documents is numbered in order.

The Piper's Toast



No explanation of "The Piper's Toast" would be complete unless some dissertation on the origins of the Piper and the pipes was provided.

Bagpipes are a Weapon of War



"The bagpipe is the only musical instrument deemed a weapon of war because it inspired its troops to battle and instilled terror into the enemy. The skirl of the pipes stirs men's and women's souls and its power and influence in battle as in life, is measurable".

The effects of the pipes on friend or foe are legendary crossing all cultural, geographic, economic and historical barriers. An examination of the origins and development of the pipes, their use among the ancient Celts and in modern warfare and life reveal their true and enduring significance.

The origins and history of the pipes is interesting as the world has known the pipes in one form or another for more than 5,000 years. Bagpipes were invented when people found they could make music by blowing into a hollow reed and eventually the idea of harnessing a bag for a reservoir of air evolved. References to pipes are made in the Pharonic literature of Ancient Egypt, the Ancient Holy Land Scriptures. During the days of the Roman Empire there are numerous references to the pipes being played and in fact it is widely believed that Nero himself played the pipes and that Rome fell to the sound of the pipes, not the fiddle as previously thought. It is quite probable that the Romans brought the pipes to Scotland during their invasions.

Duncan Cameron UE Apr 19 1927 – 20 Jan 2013

Duncan was born in Stormont County, Ontario, the



same place that his Loyalist ancestors – the McGregors, Munroes and Camerons - settled 225 years ago.

Below is Carl Stymiest UE's account of Duncan's service

I just returned from the Celebration of Life for Duncan

followed by a wonderful reception after. The service was great with the sharing of the Slide presentation that is on

the Memorial site, as well as different people telling stories and relating events in which they had known Duncan.

I was so impressed with his eulogy and they not only mentioned his love of the Vancouver Branch UELAC and his great pride in receiving his certificate for Hugh McGregor several years ago, but also had his UE Certificate and Tricorn hat with his pin on it on the Altar Table. The Pastor had everyone close their eyes and picture a time or place when we were with Duncan. Immediately, my image was that of him receiving his certificate and Wendy and I presenting his Tricorn and pin. George Baldwin and wife, Bobbie were also present and George's image was that of Duncan phoning each month to relay that the meeting was happening and what the program was. George said he could not get a word in "edgewise" until Duncan finished his message; then the conversation began.

When the Pastor was going over the photos and items on the table, he did not quite know what the 'hat" was called, so he asked. Not missing a chance to educate the masses I stood up and said that it was Duncan's TRICORN which he received with his "UE" certificate, something that he was very proud of achieving.

The Social Security Death Master File

An ominous name for an informative file. All the information is public information. You can look through this by calendar year from 1800 onwards, earlier Gregorian calendars provided for research convenience. You can also sort by name. This is an American site but I've found information about Canadians, depending of place of birth or residence, and also information about possible ancestors from other countries. There is a free link to information such as birth announcements, the father's occupation, addresses and who the informant was. Further links may necessitate joining other sites, but on this site you never know who you might find.
