

And distance



## BC GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY ONLINE LIBRARY CATALOGUE includes the Loyalist Collection.

The **BCGS** Walter **Draycott Library** and Resource Centre – now officially known as the BCGS Genealogical Library - has a permanent space for the its genealogical collection which

now numbers over 18,000 books, magazines, maps and other printed materials. In October of 2015 the Board voted to accept the UELAC Vancouver collection that had been boxed and stored for sometime. In August 2016 the UEL collection was dedicated and a celebration was enjoyed by as many of us who could fit into the space.

Discovery of resources is the key to making the best use of a collection. Although there is something rewarding about browsing the physical collection you will be pleased to hear that the BCGS Board has invested in a very good online catalogue system that does not require a login to use. It is a true OPAC – an Online Public Access Catalogue. <a href="https://www.bcgs.ca/resources/">https://www.bcgs.ca/resources/</a>

Using the keyword "Loyalist" I came up with 352 hits. You can do relevance ranking of that full list. For instance you could have the list display by date published in descending order.

A column on the left of the page of displayed results allows you to filter or narrow this large set of results by Book (290) Video (4) etc. You can also select one or more specific authors. Clicking the box next to FRYER, Mary Beacock displayed all 5 of her books held by this library.

The company behind this effective catalogue is ResourceMate. – a library automated software solution for small collections. It will also allow the BCGS to upload MARC (Machine Readable Cataloguing) files to OCLC.

I would encourage Vancouver Branch members to visit the library. Check their website for the address, hours and any temporary changes due to COVID-19. Our Branch has a BCGS Affiliate Genealogy Society Membership. (#5538).

Be Proud to be Canadian. We have much to be thankful for. As Our Queen has uttered, "We will meet again"


