Where – at the Statue of Sir Winston Churchill in Churchill Square, Nathan Phillips Square, Toronto City Hall.

When – Monday August 14, 2017, at 4.30 p.m.

Why – the Formal Unveiling of a Plaque Recognizing a World Event.

Cost – Free.

In August 1941, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill met with U.S. President Franklin Roosevelt in Placentia Bay, in Newfoundland. The Atlantic Charter, which was drafted at the meeting, set out eight basic principles, for which the free world was fighting, and which would guide the construction of a new international order, “The United Nations,” when the war was won.

Please join members of the NATO Association of Canada, the Churchill Society for the Advancement of Parliamentary Democracy, and the International Churchill Society Canada, in the formal unveiling and dedication of a plaque, donated by the generosity of Jocelyn and Edward Badovinac, recognizing a major event in Canadian and World history.
