The restaurant is located 152 metres above sea level, the highest point in Vancouver, and offers beautiful views of the park, the city, and the mountains beyond.

I especially appreciated stopping at the resting place of Canadian writer, Emily Pauline Johnson (also known in Mohawk as Tekahionwake) 1861 – 1913.

Sunday, October 5 was the big Fall Fleet event and the energy and enthusiasm in the room carried the day! Sixty guests were in attendance to celebrate 100 years of UELAC and the launch of <u>Moving Ever</u> <u>Westward – Loyalist Descendants Come to British Columbia</u>. Thanks to the efforts of editor and compiler, Dr. Peter Moogk UE, Vancouver Branch has created a fascinating record of western Canadian Loyalist family stories. A copy of this book, fresh from the press, is on its way to the UELAC Office for our library holdings.

There were anthems! There were toasts! There was cake! Every Pacific Region Branch was represented. Together we celebrated Loyalist history and heroes. As Dominion President, I had the pleasure of assisting in the presentation of a number of UE certificates as well as the Phillip E. M. Leith Memorial Award.
