Stephen was born in Sackville, New Brunswick and has lived in Lower Sackville, Nova Scotia since 1986. He claims thirteen known couples as loyalist ancestors.

Receiving his Bachelor of Arts (Honours) degree from Acadia University 1975 and a Bachelor of Education, Queens University 1976, he currently works as an elementary school teacher and author in Lower Sackville, a suburb of Halifax.

An accomplished writer, Stephen has authored two books, "The Burdens of Loyalty: Refugee Tales from the First American Civil War" and "Letters for Elly", a young adult novel recounting the true story of seven siblings in a loyalist family.

Stephen's work has appeared in numerous journals, magazines and periodicals. Many of our UELAC members will recognize him as a consistent and entertaining contributor to 'Loyalist Trails', the electronic newsletter of our Association
