

#### War of 1812 in New Brunswick

Check out the new eight links which have been added about "The War of 1812" under the Military category on the "Links" page of the website. (You don't need to be a member to access a good deal of the information on this site)

Very little action occurred in the New England States and the Maritime Provinces of Canada during this war. The people in the area, who were closely tied by family and trade, were not interested in participating in the conflict.

The population in the Maritimes depended on New England for food and the merchants there were happy to comply much to the dismay of the US federal government.

For this reason a state of neutrality existed along the land border of Maine and New Brunswick.

Military activity in the area was mostly contained to coastal communities and to privateering activities. The British did capture and hold onto a number of Maine coastal communities during the war which were returned after hostilities ceased. New Brunswick's involvement was mostly related to the raising of the 104<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Foot who undertook the now famous Winter March starting on February 16<sup>th</sup>1813 from Fredericton to Kingston Ontario. The regiment was involved in a number of important battles in the Canada's and many of the men returned to settle in New Brunswick. Despite the limited hostilities, there are plenty of records for genealogists to pour through in search of their family who lived in New Brunswick, Maine and Nova Scotia.

Were your ancestors listed among the register of enemy aliens in the United States or were they causalities of war in the Canada's? Perhaps they were issued a "letter of marquee" to engage in privateering or maybe they were ordinary seamen who were issued a "seaman's protection certificate" by the United States government.

The new links contain information that just may help you break down your own brick wall. So take some time to check them out.



### A cherished family memento

Oronhyatekha was Canada's first native doctor. He was born on the Six Nations reserve in southern Ont. in 1841 and in 1878 he entered the Independent Order of Foresters, a mutual insurance company and became its CEO within 3 years. He refused to give up his native identity and insisted on being addressed as Oronhyatekha ["Burning Sky"]. The shell was a gift from Queen Victoria with the Lord's prayer carved on it. You can clearly read it in this picture. On meeting the Prince of Wales (about 1868) he addressed him as an equal. My grandfather was the Government


representative for the Mohawk reservation in Deseronto ON. Oronhyatekha's widow gave the shell to my grandfather as a gift following O's death. Submitted by Cleo Walters
