STANLEY PARK - 125 YEARS

September 27, 1888 Stanley Park opened to the public and has been a much loved landmark ever since.

At one of our meetings, member Chris Hay UE told us the story of his great grandfather John Montgomery who, at the age of 65, accepted the position of park gardener in Stanley Park in about 1909. In 1911 John convinced the Parks commissioners to let him build a rock garden from the debris left from the excavation of the Stanley Park Pavilion. Over the next nine years an amazing sight took shape. A wonderfully beautiful attraction in its time, appearing on numerous postcards, the garden slowly became overgrown. It was not until the

big wind storm of 2006 that its location was rediscovered. A recent TV news story on Chris and his search and the finding of this



garden was one of the features celebrating the anniversary of the park. We are hoping to get a copy to show you, but in the meantime, please visit the web site below and discover this wonderful story for yourself. This historical marker was placed in July, 2011 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the start of the garden.

Fort Langley National Historic Site of Canada August 2-5, 2013 Fur Brigade Days

For the Chilliwack and Vancouver Branches, the holiday Monday has been the annual day for a picnic at the Fort under our usual big old oak tree and an opportunity to enjoy all the scheduled Monday festivities including

"The Arrival of the Fur Brigades."
Re-enactors paddle to Fort Langley




and unload dignitaries and their cargo of furs and barrels at Fort Langley's Marina Park. We cheer on the canoe brigades and hear the exciting bagpipe and black powder salute! The Arrival of the Fur Brigades portrays an annual event dating from 1848, when Fort Langley became the main depot for the Hudson's Bay Company on the west coast. Every summer in the 1850s, the fur brigades traveled down the rivers to Fort Langley. The brigades came down in canoes full of furs and other goods that had been traded from Aboriginal people at the interior forts. These goods were unpacked at Fort Langley, then



repacked and shipped back to England. The fur traders then reloaded their canoes with European supplies to take back to the interior posts. We visit with the re-enactors and watch demonstrations of sewing, trapping, cooking and historic weapons. Interesting demonstrations in the encampment culminates with the traditional Fur Trade Cook-off. We arrive early to watch the re-enactors of all ages cook up their 1800s recipes, and see which dish the judges choose as the winner.

If you or a family member wish to apply for your UE Certificate please send your request to:

- 1) Asst. Genealogist at wmdance@telus.net
- 2) You will be provided with a detailed list of instructions and the current application form used by the UELAC.
- 3) Be sure to type in the information on the form provided and complete page 9 showing what proofs you have to support your claim. If you have no computer, forms will be mailed to you. But eventually your application MUST be typed.
 4) Send the completed application by email back to above address and it will be checked and questions asked for clarification of any item. We will look for support documents only.
 5) You will be asked to email or snail mail copies of the documents you intend to use. Never mail original documents get copies to send to us.
 6) While many sources are available to us, you

need to do the basic work, we do the checking

and set up and send to Dominion asap.
