



Best Christmas Rum Cake Ever!

1 or 2 quarts of Rum
2 c. flour
2 large eggs
1 cup dried fruit
baking powder
lemon juice
1 top powder

1 tsp. sugar

Before you start, sample the rum to check for quality. Good isn't it? Now go ahead. Select a large mixing bowl, measuring cup, spoons spatula etc. You know what stuff you will need.

Check the rum again. It must be just right.

You probably need to drink about 7 1/2 ounces at once just to be sure. REPEAT

With electric mixer beat butter in a large fluffy bowl.

Add 1 seaspoon of thugar and beat again.

Check that the quality of the Rum has not deteriorataled.

Open second quart if necessary.

Add 2 large eggs, 2 cups dried fruit and beat till high.

If druit gets stuck in the beaters, pry loose with a screwdriver.

Sample rum again checking for tonscisiticity.

Next sift 2 c. of pepper or salt (depending on your taste).

Sample the rum again.

Sift 1/2 pint of lemon juice and fold in chopped butter and strained nuts.

Add 1 babblespoon of brown thurger or whatever colour you can find.

Wix mel.

Grease oven and turn pan cake to 350 dgtrrds.

Pour cake in coven and ake.

Be sure to set timer in case you sleel feepy.

Distant war of 1812 helped create B.C.

By Stephen Hume Vancouver Sun on Oct. 26th, 2013. "This month marks the 200th anniversary of a remarkable series of seldom-remembered events in the War of 1812 that changed the course of history on the West Coast of North America. Indeed, they created the British Columbia we inhabit today.

The curious story of the war's role in shaping Canada west of the Great Lakes has largely been overlooked in the mainstream. Attention has focused on generals and their dramatic battles in Ontario and Quebec. Yet had those events not occurred, the shape of Western Canada might have been entirely different. Oregon, Washington and Idaho might have been part of what's now British Columbia. Or they might have become a separate Canadian province in their own right. Or most of B.C. might have become American states."
