Old Hay Bay Church - National Historic Site Ontario

"This simple church, built in 1792 by United Empire Loyalists, recalls the early days of Upper Canada settlement. The Methodists' evangelical zeal was expressed, not only in religious practice, but also in their contributions to Upper Canada's early social and political development. Stationed on the earliest Methodist itinerant circuit, this site was the location of the first camp meeting in Upper Canada in 1805. The church was enlarged in 1835, and remains the oldest surviving

Methodist building in Canada." - Parks Canada


