

### THE LOYALIST DECLARATION OF DEPENDENCE 1776





We have all heard of the "Declaration of Independence" ratified in Philadelphia, Pa. July 4, 1776. But has anyone heard of a "Loyalist Declaration of Dependence" signed by 547 Loyalists in November of the same year? Sandra McNamara UE of the Grand River Branch, has made it her mission to discover all she can about this document and has been researching for years.
