

Letter from Vancouver Branch President, Christine Manzer UE


Greetings to the members of the UELAC Chilliwack Branch,
Our regional celebration of the arrival of the Fall Fleet of Loyalists to the shores of
Nova Scotia and the mouth of the Saint John River is a special event for the

hosting branch. Planning a theme, a speaker and the lunch in order to host our friends from around the province is enjoyable work.

Since it is our desire to have many people participate and to make wise financial decisions the Vancouver Branch executive has postponed the October 3, 2020 luncheon and celebration involving all 4 Pacific Region Branches to October 2, 2021.

(This is a tentative date but we expect that the lead-time will mean that our chosen venue will be available to us.) There will be more details to follow as we move beyond this COVID-19 crisis.

The Vancouver Branch members who were planning to join the Victoria Branch for the Spring Fleet Luncheon earlier this month also missed seeing you all then. And thinking about the Strawberry tea that happens in June each year in Chilliwack, we are "berry" sad to be missing that event.



Chris Hay UE awarded a BC Historical Federation Certificate of Recognition for Vancouver's Stanley Park Rock Garden - the first release was May 14, 2020 this is the second.

<u>FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE</u> — Vancouver's Stanley Park Rock Garden recognition receives congratulations from BC Lieutenant Governor Janet Austin

May 26, 2020 — When Chris Hay received a 2019 Certificate of Recognition from the British Columbia Historical Federation (BCHF) on May 14, 2020 for his invaluable efforts to have the Stanley Park Rock Garden recognized as a historic site in Vancouver, British Columbia, and nationally, he did not dream he would also receive a handwritten letter from BC Lieutenant Governor Janet Austin: "I am writing to offer my heartfelt congratulations on receiving the BC Historical Federation's Award of Recognition for your outstanding commitment to restoring the Stanley Park Rock Garden. What a wonderful gift you have left for all British Columbians and our travelling visitors to enjoy and cherish."

The first public garden in Vancouver, the Stanley Park Rock Garden was laid out in 1911 by master gardener John Montgomery, and was one of Stanley Park's top attractions, but the garden became neglected and gradually disappeared into the adjacent forest after the Second World War. Chris Hay, great grandson of John Montgomery, rediscovered the rock garden when he began researching his family history. A devastating windstorm in 2006 revealed lost portions of the rock garden landscape. After years of research and lobbying by Hay, the Stanley Park Rock Garden was recognized as one of Vancouver "Places that Matter", added to the Vancouver City Heritage Register, and listed on the Canadian Register of Historic Places. The BC Historical Federation's Award of Recognition is awarded to individuals who have given exceptional service to their organization or community, either for a specific project or for long service in the preservation of British Columbia's history. Sadly, due to the ongoing COVID-19 health situation the BCHF annual conference schedule for June 2020, including the awards gala, has been cancelled. Thus, the prizes are being announced early and plans are in the works for ways to honour winners during the 2020 BCHF conference.

The British Columbia Historical Federation (BCHF) encourages interest in the history of British Columbia through research, presentation, and support in its role as an umbrella organization for provincial historical societies. Established in 1922, the Federation currently provides a collective voice for over 100 member societies and 24,000 individuals in the provincial not-for-profit historical sector.

Selyca sends a special message to all her school friends.





Left: Memorial for Thomas Whaton (Wheaton), 1758-1830, Four Corners Cemetery, Upper Sackville, NB.



Your new UELAC Membership System:

First Time for Member Login to Set Up Account (from Doug Grant UE)

- #1) Go to uelac.ca note the different web address!
- #2) "Click here to set up your account."
- #3) Enter your email address (must be same one as is stored in your membership record)
- #4) Click on "Get new password"
- #5) If an error message appears just below the green box "Error: The email address isn't correct...", make sure you entered your email address correctly. If you did it correctly, send me an email as most likely your email is not correct in the member system, or is missing. Sent me a note with your branch and your correct email address to loyalist.trails@uelac.org I will check it and get back to you.
- #6) You will receive an email message from Word press, with a link in it
- #7) Click on the link
- #8) A page will show in your browser. In the "New password" box a password will show.
- #9) Delete that password (unless you like it) and enter the one you wish to use. Record the password somewhere.
- #10) Click on "Reset Password" (in blue box)
- #11) A smaller box will appear; in the green box, click on "log in"
- #12) On this screen, enter your email address and the new password, and "click log-in"
- #13) This should then show "My Account" page
- (in future it will probably show a different first page with a link to "My Account")
