Wreaths from the branch were placed at both locations. The picture at top left is from the Chilliwack Progress, while the others are





NEWS from the New Brunswick Genealogy Society: Sir Guy Carleton's Ledger: The Book of Negroes



The New Brunswick Genealogy Society is pleased to announce the addition on their website of the complete transcript of Sir Guy Carleton's Ledger: The Book of Negroes, edited and enhanced by Stephen Davidson.

From the transcript we learn that "In New York, the Book of Negroes listed the names and some distinguishing details of the 2,744 people evacuated as free people on the evacuation ships that were inspected by American and British commissioners from April to November 1783.

The ledger contains the name of Black Loyalists, indentured servants, slaves and their designated escorts. Also in the ledger are details of their military service, the names of the ships, dates of departure and destinations. Two versions of the ledger are included. One is a transcript of the full ledger; the other included only those bound for the St John River and Fort Cumberland.

This item is available in the "Members only section".

If you are interested in New Brunswick genealogy and its history, then this is a "must join" group. The "members only" section not only incudes the above, but also: First Families of New Brunswick, Anglican Registers, Cemetery Records, Land Records, Marriage Records, Ancestral lines and Family Histories, just to name a few of the twenty-seven categories.

You can easily see what is available to the public and members only in this well organized website.
