Recollections by member Gwendoline Gold UE

Prince Charles and Camilla arrived in Victoria on Friday Nov. 5th for a four-day visit to British Columbia. From the airport they travelled to the BC Legislature where a crowd of several thousand people were waiting to greet them with cheers, applause and flowers. From the Legislature they travelled to Government House on Rockland Avenue the official residence of the Lieutenant Governor of BC. During their time in Victoria, they stayed at Government House as the guests of the Lieutenant Governor Stephen Point and wife Her Honour Gwendolyn Point.

I worked as Service Manager for the Lieutenant Governor of BC for eleven years and was fortunate to work many Royal visits during my time there.

On the Saturday they returned from a day spent in Vancouver, which had included a tour of the Olympic Village, Hospital units and the VanDusen Botanical Garden. In the evening was a Reception and State Dinner. The dinner required a great deal of organizing, logistics and following protocol. What I can share is that for the State Dinner, my Service Team consisted of sixteen servers, four bus people and eight bartenders. The Kitchen Brigade was headed by Executive Chef Christope Letard and was comprised of the who's who of BC Chefs. As well as the food and beverage requirements for the Royal Party and Entourage, the Service Team was responsible for cleaning and maintaining all the suites occupied by their Royal Highnesses, Entourage and Security Detail.

The Executive Chef Christope Letard, had to create the menus for the meals for this entire group as well.

In addition, he had to ensure his own team, the Service Team, Government House and Protocol staff, even the Piper and entertainers were all fed. In amongst it all, floral displays were done by the Government House floral designers for all events and in all the suites. I must not forget about the lovely coat check ladies who volunteered from the Victoria Art Gallery. All in all, this was a vast undertaking for which I am proud to have been a part of.

My daughter, Crystal Gold UE, was also selected to be one of my Service Team due to her years of working part-time at Government House.

On Sunday they attended a remembrance service at Christ Church Cathedral. On the Monday they visited CFB Esquimalt before flying on to Ottawa. Before their Royal Highnesses left Government house, some of the many, many people involved with the successful visit were asked to come and have a photo taken with them as well as a private word. I was one of the people selected. When it came to my turn, Prince Charles said to me "Gwendoline, the State Dinner was brilliantly organized and served, Bravo Zulu" (a military phrase for well done). I was gifted with a small trinket box, inside a lovely blue box with the Prince of Wales feathers. The top of the box is based on a painting by the Prince of Wales.

I was truly blessed in my years working at Government house and have many amazing experiences for which to be thankful.



I personally found a number of family members here including Sherwood, Kierstead, Johnson, Curry and Morton. All from New Brunswick, of course.



Obituary: Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth 1926 — 2022

The Queen, Britain's longest-serving monarch, has passed away at the age of 96 after 70 years on the throne.

Buckingham Palace has said the Queen 'died peacefully' this afternoon at Balmoral. The King and Queen Consort will remain at Balmoral and return to London tomorrow.

Buckingham Palace confirmed on Thursday lunchtime that Her Majesty had been under medical supervision at Balmoral after her doctors had become "concerned" about her health.

All of the Queen's children, as well as the Duke of Cambridge, travelled immediately to Balmoral. The Queen was last pictured formally appointing the new Prime Minister, Liz Truss, at Balmoral on Tuesday, her final public duty. She postponed a virtual Privy Council meeting the following day after being advised by doctors to rest.

Queen Elizabeth II is survived by her 4 children, 8 grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren.

Her eldest son, Prince Charles, will now become King, while his eldest son, Prince William, the Duke of Cambridge, assumes the position of heir to the throne and the title Prince of Wales.

On her first televised Christmas broadcast, in 1957, Queen Elizabeth II said,
"I cannot lead you into battle. I do not give you laws or administer justice but I can do something
else – I can give my heart and my devotion to these old islands and to all the peoples of our
brotherhood of nations." And that she has accomplished through her 70-years of Service with
dignity and grace. She remaining constant, faithful, loyal and resolute to her faithful
subjects throughout the Commonwealth.

We will miss you Ma'am.

When the call arrived, we knew that it was duty calling. She had done her duty by leading her nation with dignity, grace and good humour for 70 years and setting an example for many around the world. It was our turn to say good-bye with panache. For Monday, September 19th, 2022, the muster call from David L. Smith UE of the Canadian Fencibles was 8:00 am. With the 84th Highland Regiment, and many reenacting colleagues in attendance, members of the King's Royal Yorkers, Canadian Fencibles and Royal Artillery, fired 96 guns in honour of Queen Elizabeth II at Fort Wellington where she and Prince Phillip reviewed the troops in 1984. Except on a quite warm day, there can be a cutting and damp breeze crossing the St. Lawrence at Prescott, so Her Majesty was wise to wear the brilliant blue and purple warm jacket that day in 1984.

Others in chiffon may have yearned for something more cozy!

As recounted by our reenacting historian, David More UE, one of the highlights of that 1984 day was when Her Royal Majesty was informed that the program was 15 minutes ahead of schedule and that perhaps she would like to inspect the reenactor troops. She proceeded to do so and when talking with the gun crew, she said that the 3-pound gun gave a 'jolly good bang".

Hereafter that gun was named such. Officially it is called Priapus.

It fired the first and Ninety-Sixth round on Sept 19th, the day of her funeral. The 96 shots rang out over 90 minutes on grounds of Fort Wellington only a few hours after a similar salute echoed over the tolling of the Big Ben and the marching band in the streets of London.

Prior to the gun salute, as a former Regional Vice President of UELAC, I was asked to speak 'to' the Queen.

I reinforced that on such a day, when we chose to honour her memory, it behooves us to consider that The Monarch and the Crown are two distinct, though often confused entities. As members of historical groups, we should strive to understand the differences, and improve our knowledge of the roles of each. Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II served the length of any two full careers, with extreme dignity and good example. With her gentle yet convincing confidence, she made us feel that we could be better citizens of this nation and world.

God Save the King.

"A photograph is released today of the ledger stone now installed at the King George VI Memorial Chapel, following the interment of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth," on Saturday, September 24, Instagram post on the royal family's account read. "The King George VI Memorial Chapel sits within the walls of St George's Chapel, Windsor."

The grave ledger, surrounded by several floral wreaths, sits beside one honoring Princess Margaret's death, the queen's late sister, who died in 2002, was cremated and her ashes were buried in the memorial chapel.

After the queen's death, the royal family confirmed earlier this month that her casket would be "buried together" with the late Duke of Edinburgh.
