

The meeting was then declared competent to proceed with business.


All items on the agenda passed/accepted:


Please be advised that the National Annual General Meeting is **May 24, 2025 via Zoom.**

UELAC 2025 Conference: Details, Registration and Accommodations

The 2025 UELAC Conference Committee is pleased to announce that the 2025 UELAC Conference will be held in Saint John NB, **July 10th-13th, 2025.** The conference will be hosted at the Delta Hotel in downtown Saint John beside the harbour.

Saint John, then called Parrtown, was located at the mouth of the Saint John River in Western Nova Scotia, a British Colony. Western Nova Scotia had a population of some 6,000. Parrtown in 1783 welcomed 14,000 Loyalist refugees. It was renamed Saint John in 1785 when the new British Colony of New Brunswick was created out of Western NS.

Saint John is the entrance point of New Brunswick's Loyalist story.

The highlights of the conference include guest speakers **Dr. Leah Grandy** and *Loyalist Trails* contributor **Stephen Davidson**. There will be tours of Trinity Anglican Loyalist church, the Old Loyalist cemetery, The Black Loyalist History Centre, and the Loyalist House. The Gala Dinner will feature speaker and newly appointed honorary fellow **Dr. Bonnie Hoskins**.

We will cap off the Conference with a Drumhead church service at Trinity Church with DeLancey's Brigade.

There will be free time to tour downtown Saint John to take in the stores, restaurants, markets, the container village of artisans on the newly renovated harbour-front.

Memories from past issues!

From searching through the Branch Archives, we have been able to determine that the birth issue of the Link Up titled "Loyalist Link Up" was

published in November 1994 numbered Vol 1 #1. Prior to this, small brochures were done for individual branch meetings. In 1991 it was stated that a newsletter would be developed and published at intervals as required for communication of members, and more as the Branch develops.

So firstly, let's list the original branch management team:

Note: from May 1991 brochure:

For the Record, here is a summary of our activities since Oct. 18, 1990:

Three Loyalist genealogy workshops; two meetings; assisting with a Seniors' Program at First Baptist Church; providing material of a secondary school library; liaising with the School District re help with Loyalist studies; donating a gift subscription of the Gazette to the Public Library; participation is the two day Heritage Fair sponsored by the Chilliwack Museum and Historical Society.

Note: from September 1991 brochure:

Our next meeting will be Saturday, Sept. 21 at Noon in the Candlewood Room of the ABC Restaurant to celebrate our first anniversary. Archie Miller, popular curator of Irving House in New Westminster will be our luncheon speaker. He will dress in the attire of Captain Irving and will tell of how many of our ancestors arrived in Chilliwack via Riverboat. Vancouver Branch has been invited to attend. Please come in Loyalist costume.

Note: from April 1992 brochure:

Our next meeting on April 26, at 2:00pm will be at the Museum with guest speaker Lt. Colonel Wm A. Smy OMM,CD,UE of Victoria Branch, who is writing "Doomsday Book" of Butler's Rangers. Also noted is the 50th anniversary of CFB Chilliwack. Officer of the Branch have now expanded to show Social Rep: Maribel Roos, and two additions to help Andrew Webb, the Branch Genealogist. They are Mildred Hall and Bill Horne.

Note: from November 1992 brochure:

A Christmas Tea is scheduled for November 29th at the Chilliwack Academy of Music. Also to celebrate our 2nd Anniversary. The branch management team remains the same except for the Branch Genealogist who is now Bill Horne UE.

Memories from past issues continued:

Note: from November 1995 Link Up - 5th Anniversary issue:

This issue included a list of all Loyalist Certificates approved, new applications waiting approval, and research in progress. A note from Bernice Flett, President of London & District Branch with congratulations on our 5th anniversary.

The branch also established a Memorial Library in memory of the first branch Genealogist and founding member Andrew Vincent Webb UE who had passed away earlier in the year. Branch accomplishments in the first five years include the approval of fifty-five Loyalist certificates; we have over 50 members; we have had input into genealogy and education policies nationally; we have assisted in the formation of a new branch in B.C.; and we have hosted a portion of a National Convention in 1994. All this from an area where people in the east first asked if we thought we could "maintain a branch".

Well done!

Note: from Spring March, 1996 Link Up:

We see a change in the Leadership team with Shirley Dargatz UE assuming the role of President. Lois Dickinson UE becoming Past President, Doreen Todhunter UE being named Honourary President. Jeff Curtis UE assumed the roll of Vice President. Twenty-nine certificates were awarded during the previous year with 13 submitted to date this year.

Note: Fall 1998 Link Up:

Twenty-two certificates processed by Branch Genealogist Mildred Hall UE. This issue also featured a number of clippings from newspapers. This was a first. As well, a complete up to date list of all UE Certificate granted to members together with the Loyalist names. Of note were members who had more that one certificate.

With the year 2000 being the 10 anniversary year for the branch, we see the "Link Up" becoming a publication with four issues a year.

The anniversary celebration was scheduled for Sunday, October 15th @ 2:00 pm at Cooke's Presbyterian Church. A lovely souvenir was created for all attendees.
