The “Canadian Genealogist” has been digitized by the Ontario Genealogical Society and is available in PDF on their website at <https://ogs.on.ca/databases/canadian-genealogist/>. Loyalists everywhere may be interested to know that this publication contains a number of well researched articles on Loyalist history. A list of these articles is provided below.

“Canadian Genealogist” was published quarterly by Generation Press from 1979 to 1988 under the editorship of George and Elizabeth Hancocks. Contributing editors included W. E. Britnell (Ontario), Eileen Hall (Michigan), Eric Jonasson (Manitoba), J. A. McAndless (Ontario), T. M. Punch (Nova Scotia) and John Ruch (Quebec), as well as Lynn Morgan. The goal of the magazine was to publish “*records, resources, genealogies, pedigrees, and biography ... [and] to deviate into the related fields of family and local history, ... and perhaps even into social history. ... material of interest to Canadians throughout this huge, yet often regionally isolated country.*”

For those living in Ottawa, the Sir Guy Carleton Branch also has a complete printed set in its Library at the City of Ottawa Archives, 100 Tallwood Avenue, Ottawa.
