Directions to View Mount House from Cowansville, Québec

1 – In Cowansville, take Boul. Jean-Jacques-Bertrand (Route 104 – 139) going east until you reach *chemin* Scottsmore (Road).

2- On *chemin* Scottsmore (Road), drive about 1 klm to *chemin* Beattie (Road). About 3 klm from the corner, you will see on your right View Mount House (2240 Beattie Rd).

The Beattie family originally came from Scotland and lived three generations in Ireland before coming to America and settling in 1828 on what became Beattie Road in Dunham Township.

View Mount House, built in 1960, was the home of Arthur and Gladys Beattie. Today it is the home of Sir John Johnson Centennial Branch Vice-President, Marven J. Beattie, UE, descendant of Loyalist William Bull.

From the house, the view of the mountains is breathtaking. In one glance, you can see Jay Peak, the Round Top, Mont Echo, Mont Glen, Mont Foster, and Mont Orford and several others. Join us on August 6 and come see the view. All are welcome.
