

Canadian Museum for Human Rights

The CMHR has been honoured with more than 30 international, national and regional awards for its exhibitions, technology, design, education, communications and architecture. It is the first museum in the world solely dedicated to the evolution, celebration and future of human rights. Most recently, the CMHR won a top award at the world's most prestigious celebration of innovative digital projects by museums and cultural institutions for its exhibition Mandela: Struggle for Freedom – winning 1st place over finalists including Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, the J. Paul Getty Museum in Los Angeles, and the Anne Frank House and Van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam.
