1) <u>CHINATOWN WALKING TOUR</u>- SATURDAY 30 MAY AT 10:30am WITH <u>JOHN</u> <u>ADAMS</u>. (If not attending the UELAC- AGM at 9:00am) Why Not Savour the delicious smells and bold colours of Canada's Oldest Chinatown.

Chinatown Walks are 90 minute walking tours through Canada's oldest Chinatown. Follow in the footsteps of gold miners, merchants, labourers and revolutionaries as we wind our way along

Chinatown's main streets and then weave into Fan Tan Alley (the city's most infamous thoroughfare).

History, culture, religion, politics and current issues of Chinatown are discussed and we always go into at least one building. A tasty Chinese snack is usually included and you can look forward to learning some basic Cantonese while you explore Chinatown with us.

One of Victoria's foremost historians, John Adams has been leading tours through Chinatown and some haunted places of Victoria since 1970.

The Bright Pearl Statue is in front of the Starbucks at the corner of Government and Fisgard Streets, across from the Gate of Harmonious Interest leading to Chinatown. <u>COOK STREET VILLAGE-</u>OR Saturday May 30, 2:00pm: Cook St. Village with John Adams. Walk along Cook Street from the Cook Street Village to Dallas Road. Find out about the early streetcars, Emily Carr's memories of the area, a swamp, the origins of Beacon Hill Park, heritage houses and even a neighbourhood scandal.
